
Under-Cabinet Shelf

The shelf you see in the drawing below started as a straightforward plywood platform mounted between the saw cabinet and the metal stand. I made it to provide a place to keep the miter gauge and blade wrenches handy when they're not in use. But wouldn't you know it, I thought of a couple more improvements.

The first thing I did was add another, smaller shelf to hold the rip fence. Now I don't have to look for a place to set it when crosscutting long boards.



The second addition is a small drawer under the left side. Here I can keep push sticks, throat plates, and a few pencils and rules handy and dust free.

The only other thing to take into account for this shelf is to cut a hole in it to allow dust and chips to fall through.
